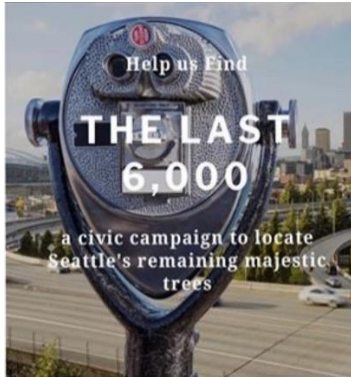


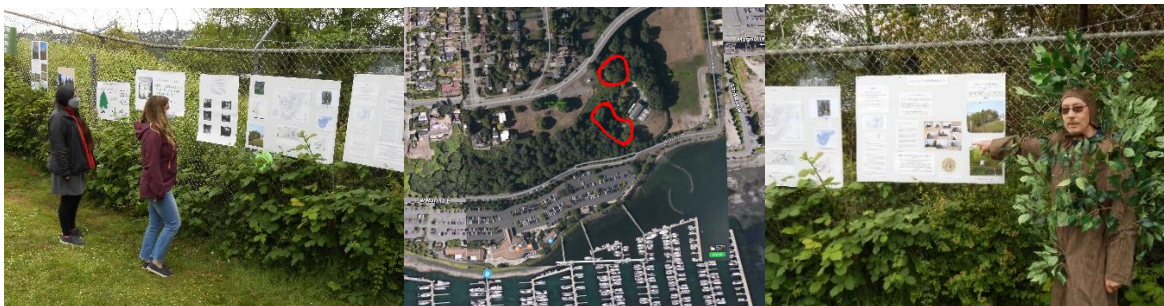

Our special edition Save the Ursula Judkins Forest newsletter features the many people who came out on our “Forest Fridays” to protest the destruction of an irreplaceable 10-acre urban forest overlooking Elliott Bay.



The Last 6000 is protesting the Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections permitting the building of two luxury estates in an Environmentally Critical Zone, that will endanger native wildlife and risk landslides along the bluff above the Admiral’s House Historic Landmark. The removal of trees for project #3028072-LU will result in the loss of at least 25 mature trees, including 3 exceptional trees and numerous trees in protected groves of trees. In addition to the 6000-7000 square foot estates, a 13-car garage and a lap pool will also be developed. The Last 6000 believes that this development is just the beginning of the lot-by-lot destruction of the 10-acre urban forest overlooking Elliott Bay and the loss of hundreds of mature trees. **Please join us for a “Forest Friday” at noon at the Ursula Judkins Viewpoint park.
