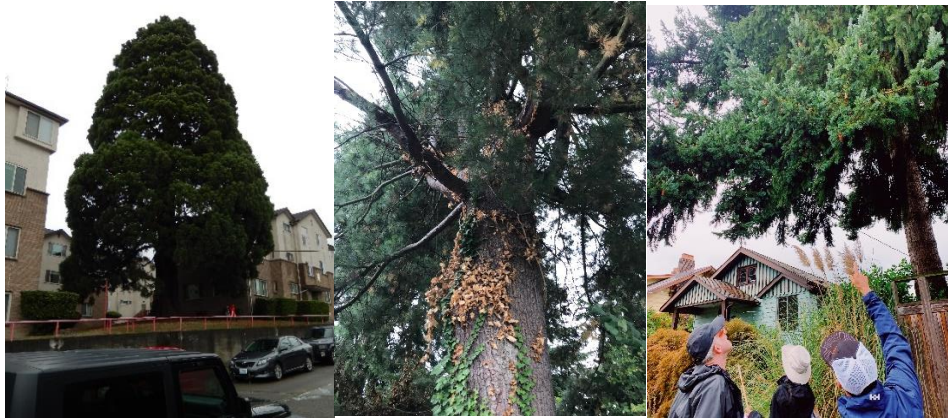


We have reached 700 majestic trees submitted! We can't thank enough the hundreds of people who have sent in information on Seattle's majestic trees since we began in April. Our Last 6000 Campaign goal was 1000 majestic trees for our six-month campaign. **Please take a moment to send in one more majestic tree from your neighborhood so we can make our goal for our majestic tree "census".**

Knowing the tree species or specific diameter is not required to document a majestic tree. You can just note that it is either Evergreen or Deciduous and that it is 30 inches or larger in diameter at breast height (DBH) per your estimation.



We had 20 volunteers brave the rain and join one of our first simultaneous Majestic Tree Strolls on Beacon Hill, Greenwood and Magnolia on Sunday afternoon, September 15th. Each group split up into a group of two or four volunteers and documented over 70 majestic trees in the three neighborhoods, including a giant Redwood on Beacon Hill, a towering White Pine in Magnolia and a Western Red Cedar in Greenwood.
